<i>Ensure outdoor sports equipment has a safe and accessible location for storage, central to school grounds used for PE.</i>	New PE shed to be installed in close proximity to school to ensure any new equipment is maintained.	<b>£4300.00</b>	Staff able to use a range of equipment which normally would be lost in the storage unit on the field. Easier to manage and stock take.	Installation by Avenue Landscapes Sep 20. No further action.
<i>Ensure school sports areas are safe for use.</i>	Have pest control keep on top of mole and rabbit infestations that take place on the school field.	Pest control contract <b>£972.00</b>	Pitch was badly effected by not being used during lockdown with rabbits and moles causing a lot of damage. Work done has made the pitch usable and safe again.	Pitch will require constant maintenance in order to keep it useable and safe for the children.
